Constitution of a **web-based entity** akin to the **studio system** of the early/mid 20th century.

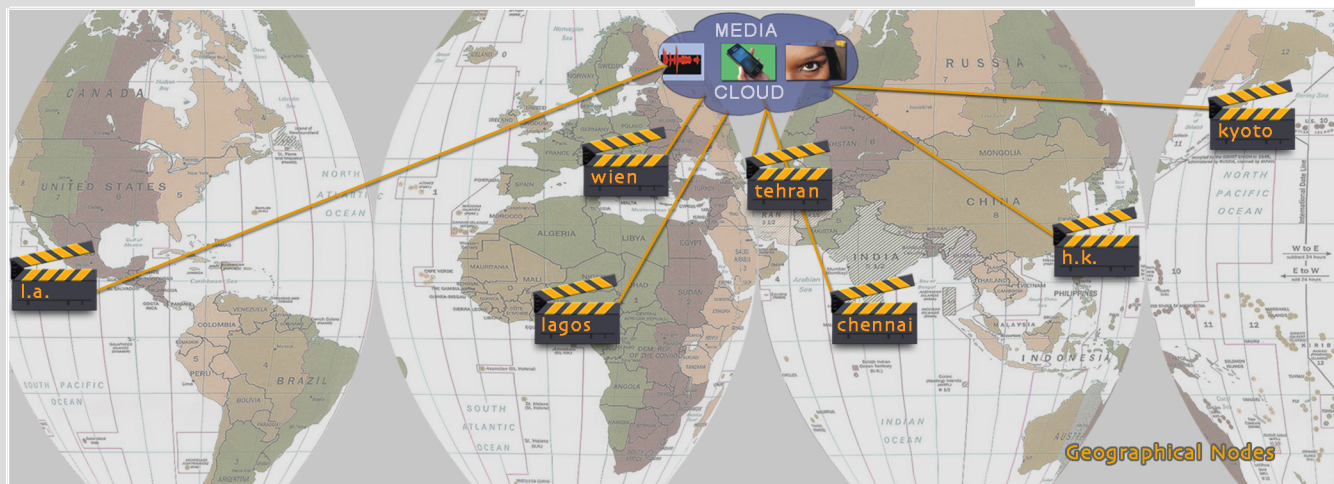
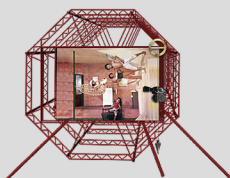


illustration from Studio Network for Assemblyline Production

THERE WAS A TIME when great movies in large numbers were made by institutions called **Studios**. Be it *WB* in LA, *Shaw* in HK or *AVM* in Chennai, well-meaning film personalities of yesteryears who worked under those studio systems - where a large number of productions happened simultaneously, talk about this entity which kept the **Quality and the Finance under a benign disciplined control**. Though Samuel Meyer at *MGM* defined this controlling entity as **the regulator who brought order into creative chaos** (In his famous quip 'the inmates have now decided to run the nuthouse' when *United Artists* came to existence as a production house), and though *MGM Studios* itself folded like the later *Golan Globus* and the likes when productions ran out of control, the studio system at one time did indeed contribute an organizational support to many individual filmmaking talents who otherwise would have been deprived in showcasing their abilities.

Let us call this Entity/ Organization/ Studio, **The Producer**. In a Studio System, **The Producer** (or the production controllers/ line producers and officials of the studio) even though not a creative member of the team, was well involved in the aesthetic parameters of a film production - right from the time of the story selection. (To some extent the role played by the *program producers* today in 21st century TV companies is similar to this).

GAME PLAN

- (1) To constitute a **NEW ENTITY** which would discharge the role of a **producer**. This entity would be a web-based organization which through its own assigned officers, technicians and creative personnel would
 - (a) offer space for identifying,
 - (b) training and
 - (c) development of talents in youngsters for all disciplines under filmmaking.
- (2) To develop a film production system which through web-based networking would allow the above talents to interact between themselves and with the guidance from **mentors** (acclaimed film personalities invited to the organization's web forum) develop story plots/scripts/storyboards for film productions.
- (3) To assign production teams for executing film projects.
- (4) To use organization's resources for finding markets around the world for the films.

Theatrical destination apart, projects shall focus on
OTT platforms. Even as of now, smartphone-specific
media content vastly falls short of demand.

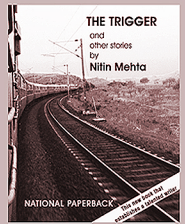

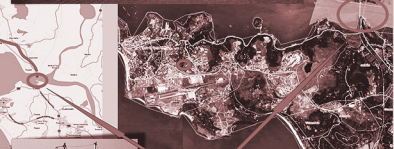

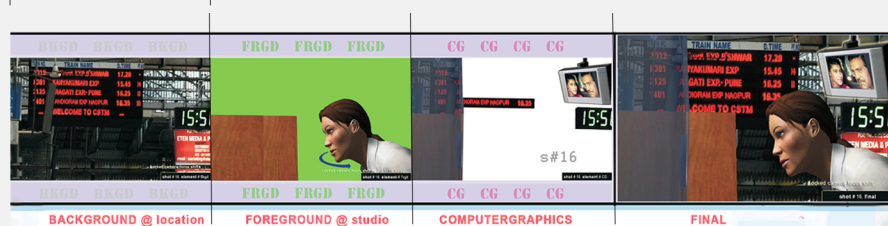

Today in the era of globalization, the production system and also the nature of the content need to be global.

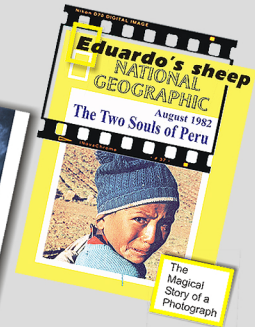
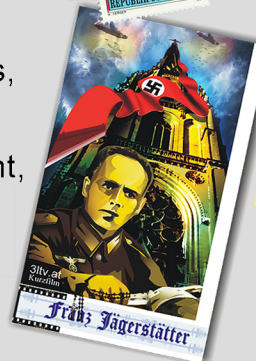
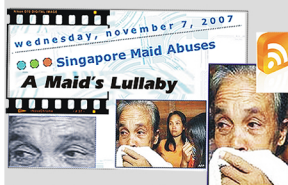
